Labour's New Deal For Working People

A Labour government will...

- Introduce day one workers' rights to improve the rules on unfair dismissal, sick pay, parental leave, and many other things.
- Make the minimum wage a real living wage and ensure that every adult worker is entitled to it.
- Ban exploitative zero hours contracts.
- Ensure anyone working regular hours for twelve weeks or more receives a fair contract which reflects these hours.
- End the practice of 'fire and rehire'.
- Ensure everyone can benefit from flexible working rights allowing everybody the chance to create a better work-life balance.
- Strengthen protections against redundancy.
- Require employers to compensate workers when not enough notice is given for cancelled or changed shifts.
- Take action to close the gender, ethnicity and disability pay gaps.
- Put mental health on par with physical health in our workplaces.

Labour Will

Make Work Pay

The cost of living crisis is causing financial misery and stress, and the Conservatives' support falls far short of what's needed to protect workers from increasing household costs.

Labour is committed to tackling the cost of living crisis and making work pay for everyone. This includes supporting well paid jobs, increasing wages, making the minimum wage a real living wage, and ensuring that workers are entitled to contracts reflecting their normal number of hours.

Labour Will

Make Work Fairer

Labour believes everyone should be treated fairly in the workplace and will give workers rights from day one on the job. Labour will tackle harassment in the workplace and strengthen protections against redundancy.

Labour will tackle the barriers that the workplace and wider society put in the way of women, black minority ethnic, LGBT+ and disabled workers and take action to close the gender, ethnicity and disability pay gaps.

Strengthen Your Rights

Labour knows that unionised workplaces are more likely to provide decent pay, workplace benefits and protection at work. Labour will remove the Conservatives' punitive restrictions on trade union activity such as the Trade Union Act 2016 and make it easier for unions to be recognised to negotiate with employers on behalf of their members.

Underpinning workers' rights will be a new Single Enforcement Body with the powers to undertake targeted and proactive enforcement work and bring civil proceedings upholding employment rights.
